Grant Resources

<u>State</u>

Parks and Recreation Trust Fund (PARTF). The fund was established in 1994 by the North Carolina General Assembly and is administered by the Parks and Recreation Authority. Through this program, several million dollars each year are available to local governments to fund the acquisition, development and renovation of recreational areas. Applicable projects require a 50/50 match from the local government. Grants for a maximum of \$500,000 are awarded yearly to county governments or incorporated municipalities. The fund is fueled by money from the state's portion of the real estate deed transfer tax for property sold in North Carolina.

The trust fund is allocated three ways:

- 65 percent to the state parks through the N.C. Division of Parks and Recreation.

- 30 percent as dollar-for dollar matching grants to local governments for park and recreation purposes.

- 5 percent for the Coastal and Estuarine Water Access Program.

Clean Water Management Trust Fund (CWMTF). This fund was established in 1996 and has been one of the largest sources of money in North Carolina for land and water protection. CWMTF funds recently have been changed by State legislation, but should remain useful tools to enhance and preserve areas around waterways. http://www.cwmtf.net/

Recreation Trails Program. The Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is a grant program funded by Congress with money from the federal gas taxes paid on fuel used by offhighway vehicles. This program's intent is to meet the trail and trail-related recreational needs identified by the Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan. Grant applicants must be able contribute 20% of the project cost with cash or in-kind contributions. The program is managed by the State Trails Program, which is a section of the N.C. Division of Parks and Recreation. Pre-Applications are due in November and, if invited, final applications are due January 31st. For more information, call (919) 715-8699. Transportation Alternatives Program. The North Carolina Department of Transportation's Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) is a federally funded program focused on projects that improve the quality of life, quality of transportation systems, and/or quality of the environment. TAP funds require a 20% match and are available in several categories including greenways.

Safe Routes to School. In 2005, the passage of the federal highway bill (SAFETEA-LU) created the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program to enable and encourage children to walk and bike to school. The program is designed to make biking and walking a safer and more appealing transportation alternative and to help encourage healthy, active lifestyles from an early age.

NCDOT Pedestrian and Bicycle Planning Grant. These funds are provided through the NCDOT Bicycle and Pedestrian Program and require a 30% match for towns and cities between 10,000 and 50,000 in population. Grants are awarded to conduct a pedestrian or bicycle planning process and produce a report. http://www.itre.ncsu.edu/PTG/BikePed/NCDOT/overview.html

Small Cities Community Development Block Grant. Funds are allocated through the North Carolina Department of Commerce, Division of Community Assistance to be used to promote economic development and to serve low- and moderate-income neighborhoods. Greenways and recreational areas that improve the quality of life in these areas may qualify.

Urban and Community Forestry Assistance Program. This program offers small grants that can be used to plant urban trees, establish a community arboretum, or other programs that promote tree canopy in urban areas. The program operates as a cooperative partnership between the NC Division of Forest Resources and the USDA Forest Service, Southern Region. To qualify for this program, a community must pledge to develop a street-tree inventory, a municipal tree ordinance, a tree commission, and an urban forestry-management plan. All of these can be funded through the program. Grants for a maximum of \$250,000 in LWCF assistance are awarded yearly to county governments, incorporated municipalities, public authorities and federally recognized Indian tribes. The deadline for applying for a LWCF grant is typically at the end of March every year.

Survey Results Summary

There were 251 responses to the survey, 228 respondents completed all 5 sections of the survey, 122 survey respondents said they lived in Elkin, 106 lived outside Elkin (23 skipped this question).

The following responses are reported for all survey respondents unless otherwise noted. Where applicable, # of responses or % or responses shown in ().

Section 1: Elkin Parks Use

- Elkin Municipal park is used daily or weekly by 56% of respondents Q1
- E & A Railroad nature trail is used more often than the OVT Trail Q5-6

Section 2: How do you recreate?

- Cornhole (85), miniature golf (82) and yard games (73) are the top reported games/activities; Q1
- Arts/Crafts (149), Concerts (100) and Outdoor Drama (89) are top reported Arts interests; Q2
- Swimming (118), basketball (107) and tennis (88) are the top reported sports activities; Q3
- Walking (182), Hiking Trails (150) and Fishing (104) and Canoe/kayaking (102) are the top reported passive outdoor pursuits; Q4-5
- Aerobics/pilates/yoga (60), arts & crafts (53), music (53) and CPR (40) are top reported Instructional Classes; Q6
- Summer camp (25) and after school (17) are the two top recreation center programs; Q7
- Weight lifting (80), fitness activities (75), lap swimming (44) and Zumba (43) are the top fitness activities; and Q8
- 4th of July Festival (151), Yadkin Valley Wine Festival (141) and the farmer's market (125) are the top three special events. Q9

Section 3: What do we need?

- Personal fitness training (91), seasonal/holiday special events (81), outdoor adventure (77) and adult athletics (74) are the top Recreation Center programs/activities to offer; Q1
- Aquatics facility (25%* weighted), restrooms accessible from the outside (16%), larger fitness room (12%) and gym floor renovations (11%*)³ are the top four weighted responses (one to five rank) of amenities to add to the Recreation center from *Elkin only responses;* Q2

³ * Weighted score for top five rank, weight is calculated as sum of; top choice x5, second choice x4, third choice x3, fourth choice x2 and fifth choice x1.

- Indoor aquatics facility (34%** weighted), expand greenway trail system (23%**), expand the Elkin recreation center (20%**) are the top three weighted responses (one to three rank) to add to the Parks systems from *Elkin only responses;* Q3 (see below for response comments)
- Music (35%** weighted), movies (22%**) and outdoor dramas (19%**) are top weighted responses (one to three rank) to add to special events at the Municipal Park; Q4
- Pre-school, seniors and high school age groups are the least adequately served of all age groups; Q5
- Only two of the 122 respondents who live inside Elkin disagree with new or expanded financial methods to help fund recreation and parks expansions and renovations; Q6
- Recreation & Parks Bond referendum (Recreation & Parks Bond 38%** weighted), Annual household fee \$25-50 (25%**) and Increase of participation fees (11%**) are the top three reported finance choices (one to three rank) to fund improvements from *Elkin only responses*. Q7

Section 4: Trail Use

- Walking or Hiking (47%** weighted), bicycling or multi-use trails (20%**) and on-street bicycle lanes/MTB (11%**) are the top four responses (one to three rank) for trail use from *Elkin only responses*, water and blueway trails are 3rd highest (12%) when considering all responses and Q1
- Connects to existing trails (34%** weighted), connects to existing parks (25%**) and addresses safety concerns (23%**) are the top three choices for determining locations of new trail. Q2

Section 5: About You

- From *Elkin only responses* Age 35-54 and ages 5-9 have the highest number of responses; Q1
- From *Elkin only responses* 72% of respondents have lived in Elkin more than ten years, 16% more than five years and 12% less than 5 years; Q3
- From *Elkin only responses* 31% of households earn less than \$50,000, 26% of households have income between \$50,000-75,000, 16% between \$75,000 and 100,000 and 19% between \$100,000-150,000; and Q4
- From *Elkin only responses* 61% prefer email notice of programs and activities, 16% newspaper and 14% social media. Q5

-Terrible waste of taxpayer money







Focus groups were conducted for the citizens, coaches, business owners, Town Parks and Rec staff, Elkin Valley Trails association, Town wellness committee members and also older adults. There were 5 separate focus groups, the format involved an overview of the planning process and intended outcomes, with 4 basic questions asked:

- What does Elkin Parks and Recreation do well?
- What would you change about Elkin's Parks and Recreation?
- What new programs/facilities/people would you add?
- Anything else that needs to be considered in the planning process?

Respondent's answers were categorized with one or more of the following; P = Program; F = Facilities and S = Staff to demonstrate what area their answer may impact.

What does Elkin Parks and Recreation do well?

Generally, there is a positive impression of the parks systems. The Municipal Park including the Recreation Center, tennis courts and outdoor pool and events are valued. It was heard more than once that people looking to re-locate, whether retirees or young families, seek out features of a park system found in Elkin.

What would you change about Elkin's Parks and Recreation?

When asked what to change, there were several ideas offered from the various focus groups. The breadth of programs offered will need to continue to grow in order to serve the community better, and also to attract more resources to the area. Reported by a focus group member, hosting a girls softball or soccer event, for example has a bigger economic impact than a boys tournament because more hotel rooms are bought by girls sports teams. In addition, direct support of the Wine Festival and other special events and support from the school system on facilities maintenance are important themes. Other changes in no particular order:

The Town of Elkin hosted an open house for the Elkin Recreation and Parks Master Plan in order for residents to review proposals and provide feedback. The meeting was held on Thursday, June 27th, 2013 at the Elkin Center of Surry Community College in Elkin, NC from 6-8:30 p.m.

Staff members from the Town of Elkin and the Piedmont Triad Regional Council were available to discuss the master plan and proposed facilities. Upon entering the room, attendees were directed to a sign-in station and given a survey to fill out. Staff created four stations for attendees to visit:

- Municipal Park
- Trails
- Crater Park
- New Recreation Programs

Maps highlighted the proposed facilities for each park and the trail system. The New Recreation Programs station was interactive by allowing attendees to vote on programs they would like added. Approximately 18 residents attended and 14 provided feedback through the survey.

In addition to the Master Plan, attendees had the opportunity to speak with Cy Stober, Water Resources Manager for the PTRC, about an upcoming watershed plan for the Yadkin River.






Elkin Future Parks Suitability Analysis

Methodology


- <u>Caution:</u> All properties or proposed greenways are conceptual and not official. This methodology is used to help the Town of Elkin look in different areas of the town for placement of new parks. Properties selected nor greenways on this analysis are official they are just used for guidance purposes.
- Identify Parcels inside ETJ; greater than 10 Acres; Vacant; Land not used for agriculture.
- Variables to determine suitability
 - **1.** Population: High population is preferred.
 - 2. Existing Parks: areas distant from existing parks preferred.
 - 3. Roads: Close proximity to major roads is preferred.
 - 4. Water: Parcels with access to streams or other water bodies preferred.
 - 5. Greenway or Potential Greenway: Parcels with access preferred
- Range of Suitability Values
 - 1. Lowest Suitability
 - 2. Low Suitability
 - **3.** Moderate Suitability
 - 4. High Suitability
 - 5. Highest Suitability
- Population Density
 - 1. Looking at number of address and classifying them into cells.
 - Based on Natural Breaks, cell value reclassification below (Cell value based on number of addresses):
 - 171 = 1 or low population density
 - 1,045 = 2 or low-to-moderate population density
 - 2,204 = 3 or moderate population density
 - 3,477 = 4 or moderate-to-high population density
 - 4,845 = 5 or high population density
- Park Distance
 - 1. Measuring distance from parks, distance classified into cells
 - Based on Natural Breaks, cell value reclassification below (Cell value based on feet away from park):
 - 2,422 = 1 or close to parks
 - 7,535 = 2 or moderately close to parks
 - 12,648 = 3 or average distance from parks
 - 17,582 = 4 or moderately far away from parks
 - 22,875 = 5 or far away from parks
- Roads
 - 1. Connection or distance to major roads important for park access, security, and viability.
 - 2. Major Roads: I-77, US 21, Bus 21, NC 268, NC 268 Bypass, Main, Johnson Ridge, Oakland, and Oak Grove.
 - 3. Measuring distance from major roads, distance classified into cells.

- Based on Natural Breaks, cell value reclassification below (Cell value based on feet away from roads):
 - 1,503 = 5 or closest to major roads
 - 2,979 = 4 or moderately close to major roads
 - 4,616 = 3 or average distance from major roads.
 - 6,039 = 2 or far away from major roads
 - 6,845 = 1 or very far from major roads
- Water
 - 1. Measuring distance from water, distance classified into cells
 - Based on Natural Breaks, cell value reclassification below (Cell value based on feet away from streams):
 - 80 = 2; property has access to water or is close-by.
 - 2069 = 0; property is not close to water.
- Greenways
 - 1. Measuring distance from greenway, distance classified into cells
 - 2. Note: many greenways being looked at are potential
 - Based on Natural Breaks, cell value reclassification below (Cell value based on feet away from streams):
 - 275 = 3; close to or has access to potential or existing greenway
 - 8791 = 0; not close to greenway.
- Totaling the Five Variables
 - 1. Weighted Sum (Elkin_Address_Density (35%) + Elkin_Park_Distance (35%) + Elkin_Road_Distance (10%) + Elkin_Water (10%) + Elkin_Greenway (10%)) = Elkin_Park_Suitability
- Parcels are given values based on total score given by sum of five variables.











Distance From Major Roads
